EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

We are humbled to look back on the growth of Just for Girls in the past 50 years, and excited to forge a new path of love, learning, and leadership for the next 50 years of service to Manatee County.

By many measures, today's girls are doing better, particularly in academics; however, girls' anxiety rates have been skyrocketing over the past ten years, and their confidence levels are taking a dramatic nose-dive by 30% between the ages of 8 and 14.

As girls approach adolescence, their belief that other people like them falls from 71% to 38%. As a result, girls can have difficulty recognizing and embracing their own unique strengths, and often sacrifice authenticity to avoid humiliation or peer pressure.

Openness to opportunity becomes buried under biological signals that bewilder young girls, and cultural messages that generalize gender norms, reject challenge, avoid failure, and deify perfection. Achievement expectations that come from outside influences are the top contributors to emotional isolation, dysfunction, and suicidal ideation in girls and young women.

Preparing girls for the wealth of opportunities around and within them continues to be our priority in the years ahead. Encouraging young minds and nurturing their passions allows girls to express themselves freely, explore the world around them fully, and build a stockpile of confidence and resilience to help them overcome future challenges and heartbreak.

We are so thankful that our community partners, investors, donors, volunteers and staff are dedicated to building a smarter, stronger, and more resilient community of girls and women in Manatee County. Together, we are helping girls live authentically, participate boldly, and achieve their full potential!

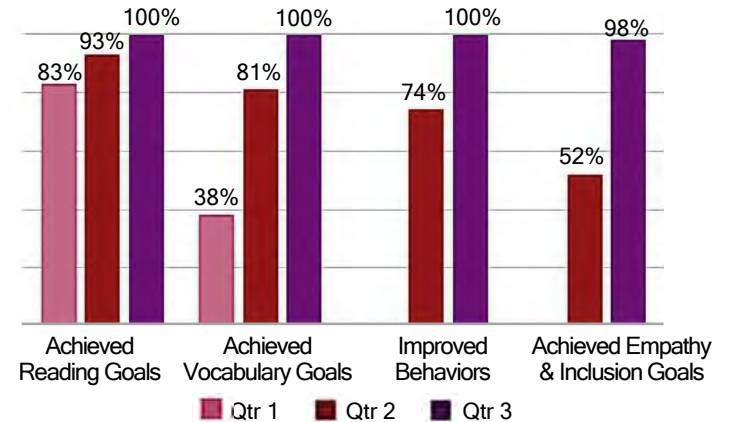

WHAT IS JUST FOR GIRLS?

1 Mission

To provide the framework within which girls can aspire to more successful lifestyles, to seek a better education, to secure meaningful and financially-equitable employment, and to become responsible and caring members of our society.

2 Alternative Education Programs

Serving 6th-8th grades since 1993 and K-5th grades since 2012, *JFG Middle* and *JFG Elementary* provide highly effective education programs that accelerate learning gains, recover academic loss, promote emotional resilience, and develop healthy habits in areas of increased vulnerability or risks to young girls and adolescents.

3 Leadership and Learning Centers

Located in North, East, and West Manatee County, *Just for Girls'* Leadership and Learning Centers provide year-round academic, behavioral, and character development programs for school-age girls Monday-Friday from 6:30 am to 6:00 pm.

OUR GOALS

- To help girls develop knowledge, skills, and behaviors that will enable them to successfully pursue educational achievement.
- To reach girls when they are forming their habits, values and attitudes.
- To promote opportunity for females in the classroom, the workplace, and in personal relationships.
- To help girls build confidence.
- To reduce high-risk behaviors by promoting healthy choices, proper decision-making skills, and positive attitudes.
- To assist students in finding the courage and determination to redirect their lives - to change, redefine, and become who they want to be.

OUR VISION

A community where today's young girls can grow up safe, capable, and smart, having developed self-respect and confidence so they keep their bodies healthy and are inspired to achieve academically. Reaching one girl at a time, we will break the cycle of poverty and strengthen our neighborhoods and community.

A CADEMICS

Our quality curriculum and multi-dimensional delivery nurtures girls' inquisitive minds and encourages critical thinking skills that will become the building blocks of all future education. Emphasis on grade-level reading and English Language Arts helps to accelerate progress, halt "summer slide", and recover learning losses that impact growth in all STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) subjects.

Scholastic Saturdays: Are offered on up to 29 select Saturdays throughout the school year (excluding holiday and in-service weekends) from 10am-1pm. These 3-hour sessions are customized according to identified student needs and prioritize grade level reading, learning recovery, and STEM components. Scholastic Saturdays are open to any school-age girl, and are designed to alleviate barriers to early academic success and make learning fun!

21st Century Community Learning Centers: JFG East provides academic intervention programs for struggling students attending recognized schools in the Manatee County School District. Eligible students attend JFG out-of-school programs at no cost, and are given opportunities for enrollment in JFG Elementary and JFG Middle.

B BEHAVIOR

Positive behavior expectations promote thoughtful decision-making, purposeful communication, emotional resilience, and peaceful conflict resolution. An inclusive environment and guided group activities provide opportunities for girls to explore autonomy, responsibility, and cooperative skill-building.

Enrichment Programs: Positive behavior support includes enrichment initiatives and activities that support and reinforce the benefits of personal accountability. Girls consistently demonstrating positive behavior are eligible for academic and extracurricular incentives, leadership responsibilities, and advocacy opportunities.

C CHARACTER

Just for Girls' prosocial values and high standards of character development inform a comprehensive curriculum and experiential learning activities that help girls build healthy relationships, strong community connections, and skills for successful collaboration and negotiation. As young girls begin to explore and construct complex social systems, JFG leads by example through the consistent demonstration of tolerance, empathy, compassion, and respect for human rights.

Experiential & Service Learning: Ballet and Music programs are incorporated into character development curriculum to promote healthy discipline, goal-setting, consistent practice, and therapeutic experiences. Reading Buddies, Project Impact, and other service-learning initiatives empower girls through leadership and service to disadvantaged individuals or groups, nurture and develop empathy and resilience, and promote healthy relationships with adults and peers as well as a connection to their community.



LEADERSHIP AND LEARNING CENTERS

Before & After School Programs

Girls develop resiliency through dependable social and emotional supports, coping skills, goal-setting, resistance skills, and positive social norms. Just for Girls provides these supports in addition to tutoring and homework help, therapeutic arts, academic enrichment, and supportive, inclusive relationships with staff and peers. Just for Girls' programs are designed to build critical skills that propel girls into the classroom and beyond.

Just for Girls' before school, after school, and out-of-school programs are open to school-age girls at an average cost of \$50 per week. Scholarships are available to qualifying families, and include breakfast and healthy snacks as well as transportation to and from Manatee County schools.

Full-Day & Summer Programs

Just for Girls adheres to the School District of Manatee County's calendar, and provides extended academics before and after school, as well as on early release days, non-school days, summer break, and select Scholastic Saturdays.



This includes STEM curriculum, academic enrichment programs, hands-on activities, and service-learning initiatives that maximize the academic development and personal growth of young girls with unlimited potential.

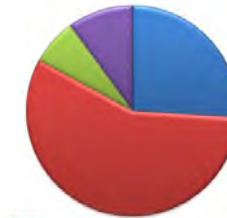
	122 girls from 50 schools participated in the 2019 Summer Reading Challenge at Just for Girls and read a total of 2,955 books!

21st Century Community Learning Centers

In the summer of 2019, Title I students suffered an average reading *loss* of 7.5 points. However, girls participating in JFG's 21st Century Community Learning Center programs *gained* an average of 17.5 points in reading proficiency over the summer months. JFG's 21st CCLC program is free to all academically or economically qualified girls in Manatee County.

ENROLLMENT:

Just for Girls' programs served **555** girls between Oct. 2018 and Sept. 2019. **366** girls attended Before School, After School or Out-of-School programs. **114** girls were enrolled at JFG Elementary, and **75** girls were enrolled at JFG Middle for the 2018-2019 school year. Total Units of Service: **321,785** (unit = one hour per girl)

TRANSPORTATION:

15,905 rides were provided to and from **20** local schools and **3** JFG Leadership and Learning Centers throughout Manatee County.

SCHOLARSHIPS:

From October 2018 to September 2019, **139** girls needed annual scholarships to attend Just for Girls' programs. Generous donors and community grants funded **66** of JFG's need-based scholarships, leaving **73** girls on the waiting list. JFG does not turn away any girl in need, and provides services at a temporary deficit until funding can be acquired.

HISTORY OF JUST FOR GIRLS

Spearheaded in 1967 by Ida Stewart and Sarah Tomberlin, the Manatee County Girls Club was created to provide local girls an educational program designed for their needs in an environment that fosters success. In December 1968, the Manatee County Girls Club, Inc. received its charter and opened its doors in Bradenton on January 6, 1969.

The organization flourished, and with the assistance of Sara Alice Harlee, opened a Palmetto center just two years later. In 1979, the Bradenton Kiwanis Club generously deeded land to Just for Girls on 59th Street West, where the West Bradenton center stands today. In 1981, the William G. and Marie Selby Foundation funded the acquisition of that facility. After a successful capital campaign led by Dan S. Blalock, Jr., both the East Bradenton and Palmetto centers relocated to brand-new facilities.

In 1989, the Manatee County Girls Club Foundation, Inc. was formed for the purpose of raising and managing funds for the long-term support and future self-sufficiency of the Manatee County Girls Club, Inc.

The name Just for Girls was adopted in 1992, and in 1993, the Just for Girls Alternative Education Program was established to serve the educational needs of middle school girls unable to succeed in a traditional school setting. In 2009, this program was renamed the Jane B. Pratt Alternative Education Program Just for Girls in honor of one of our original leaders. Just for Girls Academy, an innovative charter school serving elementary school-aged girls, opened in August, 2012. In 2016, the school district approved a new alternative education program for these targeted students, establishing JFG Elementary for K-5th grade girls.

For 50 years, Just for Girls has met and exceeded the highest standards in education, child development, prevention and intervention programming, stewardship and accountability. Providing hope for those in need, we are making a difference in our community - one girl at a time.

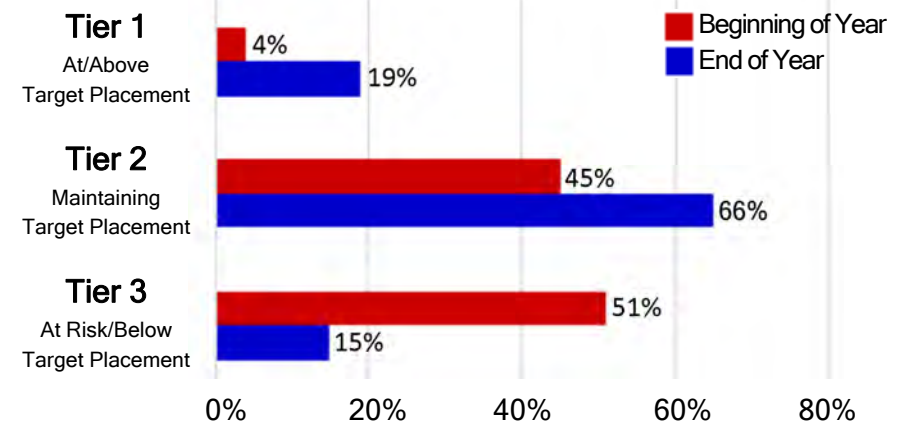

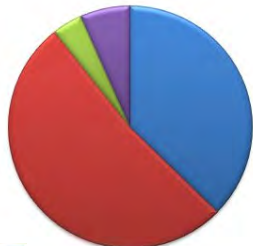

JFG Middle curriculum includes comprehensive prevention, redirection, and resilience practices designed to promote empathy, responsibility, and long-term goal achievement. At JFG Middle, girls turn F's into A's and become the leaders and mentors they are meant to be.

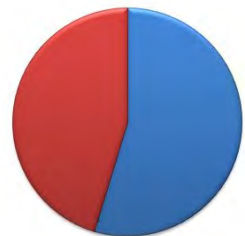

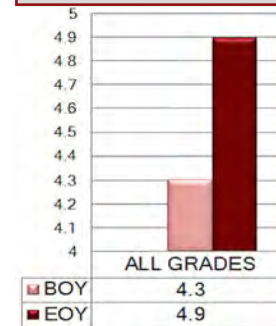

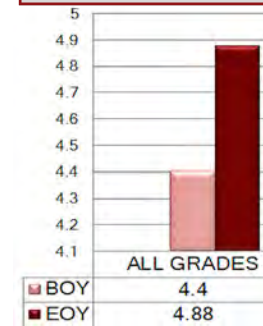

Math Progress



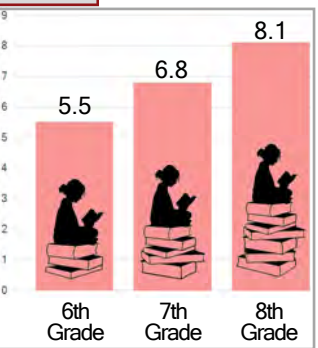
Reading Progress



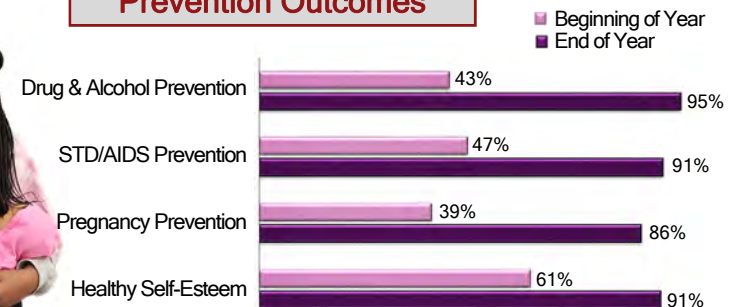

JFG Middle's responsive programming and customized instruction identifies each girl's strengths and challenges, and provides consistent academic focus and skill-building where it is needed most.

A multi-year analysis of Spanish-speaking ESOL students attending JFG revealed substantial growth in English Language Arts (ELA) proficiency. At right, a 3-year student at JFG Middle achieved an average of 1 year and 3 months of ELA progress in each 9-month academic period, restoring her prior deficits to reach grade level by 8th grade.

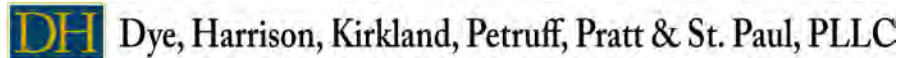


Prevention Outcomes

After successfully meeting our goals for priority Smart Growth Initiatives, we are focused on the redevelopment of JFG West. Originally built in the 1970's, the

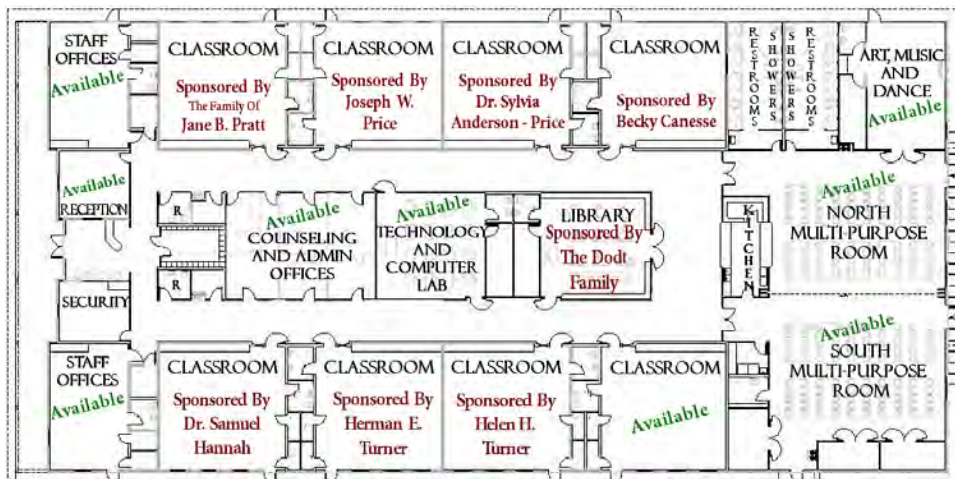
JFG West building sits on land that was gifted to the Manatee County Girls Club, Inc. by Bradenton Kiwanis.

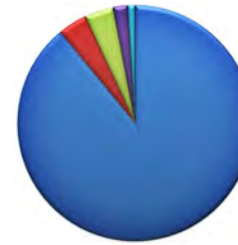

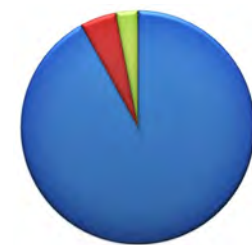
